Sin, Grace, and Newness of Life

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SESSION 1 INTRODUCTION

A. BACKGROUND

- 1. Luke 7:40-47 Degree of deliverance determines degree of thankfulness.
- 2. Ephesians 2:1 Death to life—the ultimate deliverance.
 - a) Without an understanding of man's utter failure, grace cannot truly be appreciated.
 - b) Conviction of sin precedes the enjoyment of righteousness.
- 3. Luke 2:34 Falling precedes rising.

B. OUR NATURE: SIN

- 1. Sin is more than action. It is a new quality that entered the world in Adam (Romans 5:12).
 - a) Romans 5:6-10 Without strength, ungodly, sinners, enemies—by birth.
 - b) Psalm 58:3 Essence of natural man is selfish and self-focused.
- 2. Romans 3:23 All have sinned—all need a savior.
 - a) By himself, no man can satisfy God's standard of righteousness.
 - b) Man's good works are only good by comparison with other men.

C. DEFINITION OF SIN

- 1. I John 3:4 Transgression of the law = lawlessness.
- 2. Isaiah 14:12-14 "I will, I will, I will." An act of rebellion by one's will.
- 3. What it is not:
 - a) Not an accident, a mistake.
 - b) Not solved by correcting conditions or circumstances.
 - c) Not determined by whether someone gets hurt.
 - (1) II Samuel 12:9-13 I have sinned against the Lord.
 - (2) Genesis 39:9 Sin against the Lord.
- 4. Man does not need help with his problems. Man IS the problem.
 - a) Ephesians 5:8 We WERE darkness!
 - b) Hosea 6:4-7 Verse 7 "Like men" = "like Adam."
 - c) Luke 18:9-13 Verse 13 "Be merciful to me THE sinner."
 - d) Matthew 9:10-12 Until sin is acknowledged, any help is useless.

D. SALVATION IS SO SIMPLE THAT ITS MAGNITUDE IS OFTEN OVERLOOKED

- 1. We are not to forget what we have been delivered from.
 - a) Philippians 3 Paul forgot his past "merits."
 - b) I Timothy 1:15 Paul remembered his sin.
- 2. We can never begin to understand God's grace if we don't understand man's utter failure.

SESSION 2 MAN'S CONDITION

- A. THE GOSPEL
 - 1. Romans 1:1-6; 16, 17.
 - a) The gospel is the power to save.
 - b) Salvation is needed by both Jew and Gentile.
 - 2. The righteousness of God is about to be revealed. But why should that matter to me?

B. THE WRATH OF GOD

1. Romans 1:18 Not like man's wrath. But it is very real (Ezekiel 7:9).

- 2. Romans 1:19-31 Man is without excuse.
 - a) Romans 1:19, 20 Even by the five senses, God's existence and power can be seen in the world.
 - b) Romans 1:21-23 Man's response.
 - c) Romans 1:24-26 God's response to man's rejection.
 - d) Romans 1:27-32 Further evidence of man's conscious and willing rebellion against God.
- 3. Romans 2 Specifically for those who judge others (e.g., Israel).
 - a) Romans 2:1-4 Despising the riches of His goodness = thinking that I, by my own efforts, have earned the right to judge anyone. This is rejecting the goodness of God (because I'm assuming I do not need it).
 - b) Romans 2:5, 6 By relying on my (insufficient) works, what I'm gaining for myself is even more wrath in the day of wrath.
 - c) Romans 2:11ff. Conclusion: though Israel had the law, they did not keep it. Thus they show themselves to be equally worthy of judgment.

SESSION 3 GRACE

A. ROMANS CHAPTER 3

- 1. Romans 3:1, 2 What advantage then hath the Jew:
 - a) Because they were entrusted with God's Word, they would be able to identify the savior when he came (Psalm 147:19, 20).
 - b) God made His covenants with Israel (Deuteronomy 9:4, 5).
 - c) Further benefits: Romans 9:4, 5.

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- d) Jesus Christ came in his earthly ministry to Israel (Romans 15:8).
- e) In contrast, Gentiles were without God and without Hope! (Ephesians 2:11, 12)
- 2. Romans 3:3, 4 Still, their unbelief did not hinder God—He is faithful.
- 3. Romans 3:5-9 Conclusion: all are under SIN—Gentile and Jew.
- 4. Romans 3:10-19:
 - a) Man has no response to God's verdict.
 - b) By rights, God could close here. He has no responsibility beyond it. It was man who walked away from God.
- 5. Romans 3:20 The law cannot help. But God made a promise, therefore...
- 6. Romans 3:21 The righteousness that God imparts. Mentioned in 1:16, 17, now explained.
- 7. Romans 3:22-24 By faith, "without a cause" (John 15:25).
- 8. Romans 3:25, 26 A declaration of God's righteousness.

- B. ROMANS 3:20 IF GOD KNEW MAN COULDN'T BE JUSTIFIED BY THE LAW, WHY DID HE GIVE IT?
 - 1. Through the law is the knowledge of sin. It defined sin.
 - 2. It was a legitimate offering, but the test is "Pass-Fail." It had to be fulfilled 100%. Therefore it showed the need for a savior.
 - a) The law is like a mirror. It can show you what you look like, but cannot change it.
 - b) It can diagnose, but not repair.
 - 3. Matthew 5:20-22, 27, 28 They could act righteously, but Jesus showed that the evil of sin begins with the heart, not the action.

C. RELATIONSHIP OF SIN AND THE LAW

- 1. Romans 5:20 A further consequence: the offence abounded when the law entered.
- 2. Lawlessness rejoices at the prospect of new laws to break.
- 3. God gave the law to point out sin, not to cure it. God wanted man to understand how much he needed the savior.
- D. MATTHEW 20:1-16 GOD'S GRACE IS OFFENSIVE TO MAN, BECAUSE MAN FEELS HE CAN EARN RIGHTEOUSNESS

E. WHAT DO I DO NOW?

- 1. II Timothy 2:1 Be Strong in Grace.
- 2. II Peter 3:18 Grow in Grace.

F. WORKS OF THE FLESH DO NOT CHANGE MY STANDING AS A SON OF GOD

- 1. Galatians 3:1-3 "Grace plus works" is no longer grace.
- 2. II Corinthians 10:12 A gospel of works measures man against man. Other believers become the competition.
- 3. My performance has no bearing on my standing with God.

SESSION 4 NEWNESS OF LIFE

A. GRACE IN SERVICE

- 1. II Corinthians 1:12, 3:5, 6 God supplies the ability.
- 2. I Corinthians 3:10ff. God supplies the directions.
- 3. Philippians 3:3 Just as we could not be saved without Him, we cannot live for Him without Him.

- 4. Words like humility and brokenness are not "negative"—they are essential.
- 5. Jesus Christ exhibited these qualities.
- 6. True confidence springs from true humility.
- B. II CORINTHIANS 5:17 A NEW CREATION—HOW IS THIS DEMONSTRATED?
 - 1. Substitution and identification.
 - 2. Romans 5:18 As we were in Adam, so are we now in Christ.
 - 3. Romans 6:1-4 Identification—his death becomes ours.
 - 4. Romans 6:5-7 Our old man has not been repaired, but replaced.
 - a) The body of sin: influence, entity of sin.
 - (1) We are free from the guilt of sin.
 - (2) We are free from the penalty of sin.
 - (3) We are free from the influence of sin.
 - b) Destroyed = to be unemployed, to come to an end. Contract has been terminated because the price has been paid.

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- 5. Romans 6:16-18.
 - a) If I am free, why do I still sin? Habits of slavery.
 - b) We must choose to yield ourselves to righteousness.
- 6. Romans 6:11 First imperative (command) in the Church Epistles.
 - a) Reckon = *logizomai*: a logical, mathematical conclusion.
 - b) We do not wrestle with the old man, we reckon him dead, and ourselves alive in Christ.
- 7. Romans 8:1-3 What could the law not do?
- 8. Hebrews 10:11-14 Blood of bulls and goats was only a temporary solution. Christ's sacrifice perfected us forever.
 - a) Hebrews 10:1, 2 Couldn't make the comers thereunto perfect.
 - b) Hebrews 9:9, 13, 14 Could not cleanse the consciousness of sin.

C. EXAMPLE OF A NATURAL MAN UNDER THE LAW

- 1. Romans 6 and 7 are a parenthesis. They cover four questions regarding the sin, law, and grace.
- 2. Romans 7:1-6 A practical illustration.

- 3. Romans 7:7-12 Question 3: Is the law sin?
 - a) Verse 8 Sin was not technically dead, but the law made me aware of it.
 - b) Verses 9-12 The law gave sin a base of operations.
- 4. Romans 7:13-25 Question 4: Did the law become deadly to me?
 - a) Verse 14 The plight of unsaved man under the law.
 - b) Verses 15-20 Man under law can SEE what is right, but cannot LIVE it.
 - c) Verse 21 Sin nature referred to as a "law."
 - d) Verse 22 Law of God = Old Testament law.
 - e) Verse 23 Law in my members = sin.
 - f) Verses 24, 25 The ONLY deliverance from this problem is via the completed work of Jesus Christ.

SESSION 5 ENABLED BY THE SPIRIT

- A. WALKING IN THE SPIRIT
 - 1. Romans 8:1 3.
 - a) What the law could not do (Romans 7:25).
 - b) A third law: within me.
 - c) Romans 8:26-29 The great purpose of the spirit.

- 2. Romans 8:4 Righteousness = the righteous requirement of the law.
 - a) Romans 6:11 Imitation of Christ must be preceded by identification with Christ.
 - b) Romans 12:2 We are transformed. It's a supernatural reality, not simply a motivation to work harder.
- 3. Galatians 5:1 We now live by a new standard. Better to fail at this than to succeed at religion.
 - a) Galatians 5:16, 17 By walking in the spirit we cannot fulfill the lusts of the flesh.
 - b) Galatians 5:22, 23 Walking in the spirit yields the fruit of the spirit—against such there is no law.
 - c) Galatians 5:24, 25 All who are born of the spirit have the ability to live this way.
- B. NOT JUST CHANGING HABITS, BUT A HOLY LIFE
 - 1. Ephesians 5:3-10 Practicing who you are.
 - 2. I Thessalonians 4:1-8 Pleasing God, doing His will.
 - 3. I Corinthians 6:9-12, 19, 20.

SESSION 6 GOD'S INNER WORKING

- A. GALATIANS 2:20 CHRIST LIVING IN ME
 - 1. II Corinthians 3:18 The Great work of the spirit.
 - 2. II Corinthians 3:3.
 - a) Quoted from Jeremiah 31:31-34.
 - b) A related promise in Ezekiel 36:26, 27.
- B. Hebrews 8:10-12 is this limited to Israel?
 - 1. Hebrews 10:14-17 Clearly speaking of the new birth.
 - 2. Consider other Old Testament prophecy.
 - 3. The promise of Jesus Christ: John 14:16, 17, 26.
 - 4. John 16:12-15 Guide = to lead, not to force.
- C. ROMANS 8:10, 11 THE SPIRIT IMPARTS LIFE
 - 1. Romans 8:12-14 Led by the spirit.
 - 2. Ephesians 4:25-30 Spirit can be resisted (grieved).

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- 3. Philippians 2:12, 13 Requires my cooperation.
- 4. Philippians 2:14, 15 Shining as lights (see II Corinthians 3:18).
- D. PHILIPPIANS 1:6 GOD'S WORK IN US
 - 1. A growing love for truth.
 - 2. James 4:5 The spirit yearns jealously.
 - 3. James 4:6, 7, 8a The spirit enables us to resist.

SESSION 7 FINAL CONSIDERATIONS

- A. TITUS 2:11, 12: THE GRACE OF GOD TEACHES US HOW TO LIVE FOR HIM
 - 1. Verse 13 Our Hope is a wonderful help (see I John 3:1-3).
 - 2. How does grace teach us? II Timothy 3:16, 17 paideia.
 - 3. I Corinthians 9:24-27 This will never be easy, but will always be necessary.
 - 4. Hebrews 12:1-11 The peaceable fruit of righteousness.
